#### EMRS NATIONAL CULTURAL FEST 2022-23

#### BRIEF REPORT

### **SYNOPSIS**

The third edition of EMRS National Cultural Fest was organized by National Education Society for Tribal Students (NESTS), an autonomous organization under Ministry of Tribal Affairs (MoTA) from 31st October to 02nd November, 2022 at Bengaluru, Karnataka. The 3-days' magnanimous cultural event was hosted by Karnataka Residential Educational Institutions Society (KREIS) at Art of Living International Centre. It was a massive ceremony in which around 1400 Eklavya Model Residential School (EMRS) students from across the country came together to celebrate India's cultural unity in diversity. More than 25 events took place during the three-day fest, from dance and song to quiz and storytelling etc. Tribal Cultural Display was an added feature of the event in which tribal and indigenous dance forms, food and cuisine, clothes and ornaments were showcased by 10 states.

The Ministry has been organizing EMRS Cultural Fest and Sports Meet each year to provide tribal students a national platform to showcase their hidden talents in different spheres. This three-day event holds immense significance for NESTS as it is NESTS' first year of holding the mega-event and third for the Ministry. The event shall give impetus to all-round development of tribal students pursuing education in *EMRSs* confirming with the spirit of Government of India's initiative of Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat (EBSB) promoting sustained cultural connect and celebrating unity in diversity through national integration.

The opening day i.e. 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2022 had been chosen as an auspicious day for the cultural fest as it was the *birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel whose was instrumental in unifying the country after independence*. Oath of Unity was taken by all the attendees on this occasion.
